My Fellow Pastors, I know I do not need to remind you that **the world's greatest need is personal knowledge of God**—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I write that as an American, but the need for relationship with God is also great beyond the United States, right?

While we pastors know that this is the biggest need, a group of people—Religious None(s)—does not think so. "Religious Nones" include people who are not part of a religious group, are not religiously active, and have little or no religious commitment. They include atheists and agnostics. They also include people who are not anti-religious, but they do not presently feel a need to have a personal faith in God. Maybe they are confused by life or by the world so they do not give personal commitment to God.

In the 1980(s), about 10% of Americans were Religious

None(s). Now, it is about 23%.

The need for relationship with God is huge, and we pastors have the great opportunity to "harvest"
