Prophecies about the Messiah (Issa) in the Old Testament (Tawrat and Zabur):

Isaiah 7:14 --- "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel (God with us)."

• Fulfilled in Luke 1:35 of the Injeel

Genesis 3:15 --- "And I will cause hostility between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring. He (serpent/Satan) will strike a your head, and you will strike his heel."

• Fulfilled in 1 John 3:8 of the Injeel

Isaiah 9:6 --- "For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

• Fulfilled in Luke 1:31-33 of the Injeel

Zechariah 9:9 --- "Rejoice, O people of Zion! Shout in triumph, O people of Jerusalem! Look, your king is coming to you. He is righteous and victorious, yet he is humble, riding on a donkey--riding on a donkey's colt."

• Fulfilled in Matthew 21:1-10

Exodus 12:21-27

• Fulfilled, as described in 1 Corinthians 5:7 of the Injeel--- "Get rid of the old "yeast" by removing this wicked person from among you. Then you will be like a fresh batch of dough made without yeast, which is what you really are. Christ, our Passover Lamb, has been sacrificed for us."

Regarding the authenticity of the Bible, God himself revealed the Bible by divine inspiration to 40 eyewitnesses, in three languages, over three continents within a 1500-year period. As well, there are over 24,000 manuscript copies (in Greek, Syriac, Latin, Coptic, and Aramaic text) of the New Testament (Injeel) in existence today. These manuscripts have been copied with greater accuracy and earlier dating than any other secular classic from history. No other book, including the Qur'an comes close to this wealth of evidence.

<u>Comparatively</u>, there is only one eyewitness to the revelations of the Qur'an: Mohammed. The Qur'an disagrees with itself as to the time frame in which it was revealed: was it in one night (Qur'an 44:3) or was it over a period of time (Qur'an 17:106)? As well, there is no manuscript evidence of the Qur'an (in its complete and original text) dating back to the 7th century.
